

CAMPUS SAFETY

The Chiefs of Police for Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College will prepare and annually update reports of all occurrences of crimes and arrests committed on their respective campus that involve violence, hate violence, domestic violence, rape, date rape, stalking, theft or destruction of property, illegal drugs and alcohol intoxication. The reports shall also include all occurrences of non-criminal acts of hate violence reported to campus police. Written records of non-criminal acts of hate violence shall include at least a description of the act of hate violence, the victim characteristics, and offender characteristics, if known.

In addition, the Chiefs of Police for Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College will prepare, update, post for public viewing, and disseminate to all students, staff and faculty an Annual Security Report as required by the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Annual Security Report provides campus crime statistics, crime victim support information, and policies and procedures for reporting campus crimes.

Crime prevention is a top priority in the South Orange County Community College District. The campus police departments support a pro-active crime prevention program that works closely with the community and other law enforcement agencies to make the South Orange County Community College District a safe and secure environment in which to learn.

The campus police departments offer various crime prevention materials and maintain informative web sites for public access.
