INSTRUCTION

NURSING PROGRAM

The college shall consider all of the following when screening applicants for the nursing program:

- Academic degrees or diplomas, or relevant certificates, held by the applicant;
- Grade point average in relevant coursework;
- Life experiences or special circumstances of an applicant;
- Proficiency or advanced level coursework in languages other than English.

Applicants to the nursing program who have earned a baccalaureate or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning are not required to complete any general education requirements. Instead, these students only need to complete the coursework necessary for licensing as a registered nurse.

Applicants to the nursing program must possess a social security card

- to enable a background check to be completed and
- to be eligible to apply for NCLEX licensure upon program completion

Nursing students are subject to all policies, regulations, and guidelines outlined in the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Student Handbook published by the Saddleback College Nursing Department.
