

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH

The Chancellor or designee shall ensure the safety of employees and students by:

- A. Complying with the United States Department of Transportation regulations implementing the Federal Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991. Specifically, the District shall comply with the regulations of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and, if applicable, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). Compliance with this policy is a condition of employment for those employees who transport students. (Refer to BP-6530 *Drivers for District Sponsored Activities*, AR 6530 *District Driver and Vehicle Use Policy* and BP-6950 *Alcohol and Controlled Substances Testing*.)
- B. Establishing an Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP) in compliance with applicable Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations and state law. The IIPP shall promote active and aggressive actions to reduce and/or control safety and health risks. (Refer to the District's IIPP.)
- C. Establishing a Hazardous Material Communications Program, which shall include review of all chemicals or materials received by the District for hazardous properties, instruction for employees and students on the safe handling of such materials, and proper disposal methods for hazardous materials. (Refer to AR-6850 *Hazardous Materials*, the District's Hazard Communications Program, and Waste Management Plan.)
- D. Prohibiting the use, sales, distribution, or advertisement of tobacco and marijuana products while on District premises. (Refer to BP/AR –3570 *Smoke and Tobacco Free District*.)
